DISTRICT BOARD MEETING EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT KIERA HAGERMAN MAY 15, 2025

Education

In the last 2 months, our educators have reached 1798 participants which includes school aged children and adults in 14 of our communities. 98% of summer program slots are full. Tonight, our educators are at the Parent Resource Fair at the Dean and Barbara White Community Center.

Field Operations

We have put a large focus on advertising and outreach for our field programs as well. So far, each of our HHW collections have doubled in participation from a year ago. We were in Hobart last night and had about 260 cars come through for our first mid-week, afternoon collection. The next collection is at the Hudson Campbell Center in Gary on May 31st.

Our first paint recycling collection also drew a much larger crowd than expected. We had such a line at 8 am that we started early and ended up with over 200 cars and an almost full semi of paint. Our next paint collection is scheduled for Nov. 1.

We have already surpassed the number of residents who came out last year for our free compost. As of Monday, we have had 125 residents come out and planting season is just beginning.

RFPs that are included in your packet for our 3 major field programs (tires, electronics, and HHW) are scheduled to be sent out on June 2. Current contracts are in place for the remainder of this year and new contracts would take effect on Jan 1, 2026. My plan is to present recommendations to the board at the September meeting.

Administrative Report -

20-year plan update work with GT Environmental is underway. We have spent the last several weeks gathering baseline and historical data that will be used to guide us. I have had one member of our CAC, Ivy Wilcher, volunteer to work with us. I am in need of a few board members who are interested in helping with the process.

Website updates have also begun. Von and I will have weekly status calls with american eagle in order to keep the project moving. The entire project is expected to take 4-6 months.

The proposed budget that is in your board packet is tentative but is the max that it would be. We do not yet know the impact of SB 1 and are waiting on guidance from DLGF. Numbers may have to be reduced, but it would be no higher than what is presented.

The Chevy Volt is in need of some repairs, but it is a 2015 model and the parts that are needed have been discontinued and are not available anywhere in the country. Since it is not repairable, I would like to trade it in while it still has some value.

We are having drainage issues across the front of the building. The company that we currently use for lawn maintenance has provided a quote for grading of the grassy areas as

well as adding some foliage to help with drainage. With the board permission, I would like to proceed with those improvements.

The Grant and Finance committee met several weeks ago, looked at the proposed 2026 budget, discussed the Re-Trac reports, and recommended the release of grant checks for this year.
