## PLASTIC:

- 1 Beverage containers, water bottles, pop bottles
- 2 Milk, water, juice jugs, shampoo bottles, and detergent bottles
- 3 Cooking oil bottles
- 4 Margarine tubs, squeezable bottles
- 5 Yogurt cups, kitty litter bins, cream cheese bins
- 6 Plastic/polystyrene: solo cups & styrofoam (THROW AWAY!!!)
- 7 Other plastics

## Drop Off and Curbside Recycling Guide



## PAPER:

Food & drink cartons, CLEAN cardboard (no pizza boxes), copy paper, newspaper, magazines, cereal boxes, envelopes, junk mail, TetraPaks

## METAL:

Aluminum cans, clean tin cans, steel cans, metal caps from jars



These items are recyclable in your curbside bin or drop-off center. Non-recyclable items create problems for facilities and cause good recyclables to go to the landfill!

The lists provided have examples and are not meant to be exhaustive.

## GLASS:

Bottles and jars that contained a food or drink. Rinse and separate caps!



# DO NOT PUT THESE ITEMS IN RECYCLING BINS!

# RECYCLING: RULES OF THUMB

- If it's plastic with NO symbol, throw it out.
- All #6 plastics and styrofoam must be thrown away.
- Do not bag your recyclables in plastic bags!
- All containers must be empty, clean, and dry.
- No electronic components! Contact the LCSWMD or your local municipality about local collection sites.

## The following commonly misplaced items DO NOT go in a recycling bin.

## Paper & Fibers

Burnt paper  
Carbon paper  
Napkins  
Paper cups, plates, etc.  
Shredded paper  
Tissue or tissue paper  
Wallpaper  
Wrapping paper

## Yard Waste

Compost  
Grass  
Leaves  
Mulch
